
Additionally we are just finalizing our plans to begin site preparation work for Hope Academy in January or February 2018. The work will include grading, stream bed and road improvements, drilling a water well, and boundary wall construction.

A RECENT VISITOR

In September, Jenny Gonser—a junior at the University of Washington who previously travelled to COF with the 2014 LOPC mission team—visited again for a little over a week. Although her trip was brief, she squeezed in many activities, classes, and projects. She brought letters for all of the kids from students and leaders who went on the recent LOPC mission trip to COF in July of this year. Each student and staff member also added their own colorful handprint to a huge tree mural, a week long project that turned out to be very successful.



HOPE FOR INDIA CLUB

Two Lamorinda Area high schools, in California, now have student clubs to support Children of Faith and Hope Academy. These clubs, both called "Hope for India," were formed by high school students who visited COF this past summer.

These clubs support us in two ways: (1) the high school students exchange "pen pal" letters with the children. This helps the children in India with their English reading and writing, and (2) the clubs conduct fundraising activities, with money raised going toward the building of Hope Academy. Helping fund Hope Academy is a natural fit for a local high school club!

The turnout for the clubs has been great, and Rosie was able to visit each club when she was here last fall. She spoke about the daily life of the children at COF and shared plans for a school that will educate COF's children, as well as hundreds of others in their community. OPERATING A VERY BIG HOME

The full operating cost for the Children's Home and school is about \$1000 per child, per year, or about twice the amount of the annual child sponsorship donation.

Our biggest cost is food. Rice, chicken, fruits, vegetables and other groceries to feed our large family of over a 100 is about \$30,000 annually. Our cost to employ staff and teachers is relatively low at about \$22,500. Then we have utilities, school supplies, clothing, maintenance, medical, transportation, and various other miscellaneous costs that round out our operating expenses. We do everything we can to get the most out of the generous gifts we receive.



COOKING CLASS FUNDRAISER

During Rosie's recent visit to California she shared some of her Indian Cooking secrets at two cooking classes. These classes were graciously hosted by COF supporters, and attended by other supporters and friends. While sipping mango lassis, the students chopped, stirred, mixed and garnished. They then sat down and enjoyed the dishes they had made. Guests donated \$200 each to join the fun and the proceeds from the classes will help Children of Faith buy a bus to transport the children to church and around the community. The classes were very popular, so look for similar opportunities on a future visit by Rosie.
