

We were happy to have a visit from Amar Singh, his wife and sister, who have been supporting Children of Faith for over a decade. This is what Amar had to say after the visit.



"Just to say we are impressed would be an understatement—we are HUGELY impressed. All the children are clean and neatly dressed in their uniforms, look happy and well fed, cheerful and friendly. There is a big emphasis on respecting and helping each other, like a family, with many of the older children helping the younger ones with responsibilities.

When we visited the classrooms, the children were totally ready and eager to show us their school notebooks, recite poems or multiplication tables, sing a song or act a bit, and speak with us. The handwriting we saw was wonderfully neat, and it is evident that the teachers are engaging the kids well in class. All the children who finished 10th grade are now enrolled in junior college, which is a great achievement. (My sister, who is a retired teacher in India, says the school is doing much better than she expected, and seems to be as good as or better than many other schools). The results are heartwarming, and we wish Rosie and Anand and their "family" happiness and continued success, both at COFM and in Hope Academy. We will certainly continue our support and personal involvement.

The children always look forward to their annual beach day. The bus now enables the children to go to the beach and parks more often. With two buses, 120 children, staff, and lots of food and snacks, we headed to the beach. Once again there was joy all around with the giggles of the children louder than the crashing waves.
